FUPOL available on the SAP HANA® Cloud Platform

FUPOL (www.fupol.eu) is now available on the SAP's HANA Cloud Platform. It has been selected as one of 30 innovative European projects to get full support from SAP as part of their Platform Development Accelerator for SAP HANA. FUPOL is an FP7 project now successfully completed, it provides a solution as an open platform with a set of tool kit for a completely new approach to traditional politics building on major innovations like multichannel social computing, crowd sourcing and simulation

The four pilots of CLIPS in the cities of Bremerhaven, Lecce, Novi Sad and Santander are ongoing



CLIPS (www.clips-project.eu) is an EU co-funded project, which aims to overcome the barriers of delivering Cloud-based public services by using innovate solutions that offer interoperability and efficiency. Now into its second year, the four pilots in the cities of Bremerhaven, Lecce, Novi Sad and Santander are all running phase 1 services, with the areas where these services are being piloted including education, registration and utilities. Phase 2 services are due to start early in 2016.

The ROUTE-TO-PA project is now releasing the SPOD and TET platform to support social discussions based on Open Data



The Route-to-PA Consortium is now releasing the Social Platform on Open Data (SPOD) and the Transparency-Enhancing Toolset (TET) to support the pilot activities that are planned to start in February in Prato, Den Haag, Groningen, Dublin and Issy-les-Moulineaux. The SPOD is now including the access to several Open Data platforms and the building of datalet for data representation, as a support to social discussions. TET is now providing connections and links to related datasets, and offers better personalized search and recommendations based on user's profile.

City.Risks is now focusing on the definition of use cases in the pilot cities of Rome, Sofia and London Waltham Forest



So far, the Consortium has identified the following application contexts: theft detection (cars and bicycles), criminal activity in crowded areas, tourists/new residents in a city, citizen engagement and neighbourhood safety. Meanwhile, a survey is being carried out in the pilot sites to identify user's needs and interest in the usage of the project platforms. City.Risks leverages innovative technologies, city infrastructures, Web and social media to increase the security of citizens in large cities. Citizens will be actively contributing to the fight against crime and the increase of security level in their daily activities.
